alight, sweet hearted (Dramaturg)

An original adaptation of the Hansel and Gretl tale by Karen Li, performed in a promenade immersive style. Dramaturgical role includes script work, movement devising workshops, and consultation on performer-audience relationship and audience experience. Performing at the Strand Theatre April 2024.

I am a tree in your life (Dramaturg)

An outdoor, one-person performance for one audience member created and performed by Bao Nguyen, about the possibilities created by forgetting, and how humans can rethink our relationship to trees in our communities. Dramaturgical role includes collaboration on narrative sculpting and text creation, performer-audience relationship, and audiences experience. To be premiered in the garden space of the Ivy Bookshop in Baltimore, Fall 2024.

Voyages: Chapter 7 (Core Devising Team)

Submersive Productions. Commissioned by the National Aquarium as part of their Voyages series, Submersive will work with marine biologists to create an audience-centered performance experience based on our guiding questions: How can we make a performance that will be pleasing to the fish and creatures of the Aquarium? How can we shift to be in community with the natural world rather than trying to control it? Currently in early devising stages and scheduled to be performed at in the National Aquarium, July 2025.

Selected Directing & Devising/Collaboration History

R/J (Director)

R/J was an adaptation of Romeo & Juliet conceived by O'Malley Steuerman and Betse Lyons, adapted script by Aladrian Crowder Wetzel and Elizabeth Ung, as well as significant contributions from the acting ensemble. Centering queer experiences and "body enthusiasm" in all staging and design elements, R/J both updated and re-explored the original text in a way that reminded us all why that play is so enduring. Performed June 2023 at the Strand Theatre.

Katalepsis (Core Devising Team, Directing Focus)

Subversive Productions. Set in the far future, *Katalepsis* was an exploration of how humans create culture in deep isolation, and how we connect to each other when most paths to connection are gone. Originally conceived in 2019, the process of creating the show often paralleled our own emotional and physical journey through the pandemic. Performed March-May 2023 at the Peale Center.

Untitled Cave Play (Core Devising Team/Performer)

Working with long-time collaborators Jessica Lopez-Barkl and Emily Windler of In Strange Company, this piece is an adaption of true story, of two people who lived in a cave in Central Park for a year during the Great Depression. Linking history to our experience of isolation, disconnection, and crisis during the pandemic, this piece will use clowning, physical comedy, and object puppetry to explore how relationships change in quarantine, the economic disparities that arise during a crisis, and what humans will do to feel "normal" under the most absurd circumstances. Currently in workshopping, with a development residency at the North American Cultural Laboratory (NACL) in July 2022.

Trouble in Mind (Dramaturg)

Dramaturg for Alice Childress' *Trouble in Mind*, with Director Danielle Drakes, at the University of Maryland Baltimore County (UMBC). Curating research for undergrad actors on the history of racism and acting in theater in the US, as well as coordinating campus talks, audience engagement materials, and talkback panels for the production. Nov 2022.

rECHOllection (Core Devising Team, Directing Focus)

Submersive Productions. *rECHOllection* was Submersive Productions' first inperson performance since the pandemic began, and was devised with an ensemble of visual artists and performers, and performed in Druid Hill Park. Set in the near future, *rECHOllection* was created to be an open-ended exploration between audience and Baltimoreans of the future, brought together in a temporal rift in the park, exploring questions of community, survival, memory, and interdependence. *rECHOllection* was a performance that stood on its own, but we are also considering it a prologue to much larger future project, *Katalepsis*. Performed Oct-Nov 2021 in Druid Hill Park, Baltimore.

This Remains (Director)

This Remains was a devised, site-specific performance created with UMBC students as their first in-person performance since the fall of 2019. Students created original characters and stories, and sculpted a journey for the audience through the outdoor spaces that surround the Performing Arts Building, opening up space for questions about history, mythology, fairy tales, identity, and what we want future generations to remember about us. Performed October 2021.

The Oresteia: Live! (Ensemble Deviser/Lyricist/Performer)

An adaptation of Aeschylus' Oresteia Trilogy as a 1940s-style radio musical comedy. First devised and performed in Albuquerque, NM in 2007, this updated version was re-adapted for Zoom performance with original In Strange Company members, and performed virtually Dec 2020.

Out of Time (Deviser/Performer)

Commissioned for the first cohort of the Performance Interface Lab, which was experimenting with 1:1 virtual immersive experiences in the first months of the pandemic. *Out of Time* was created in collaboration with Joan Cummins, and explored our relationship to the concept of time through map-making. Sold out, extended run April-May 2020.
