Lewis Museum in Baltimore, The Dixon Gallery/Garden, Memphis, TN and the Baltimore Museum of Art.

She has served on several boards including Maryland Art Place, School 33, Wide Angle Youth Media, Creative Alliance and The Build Haiti Foundation. She was the Program Director for the Maryland State Arts Council's Individual Artist (1979-92) and Visual Arts programs (1990-92).

Ms. DeVane, was the Director of Tuttle Gallery and former head of visual arts at McDonogh School in Owings Mills, MD. In 2007, she was a recipient of the Rollins/ Luetkemeyer Chair for Distinguish Teaching. Ms. DeVane is also the recipient of 2017 Rubys Grant, two Art Matters grants 2017/2019, a Trawick Prize 2019 and the Anonymous Was a Woman Grant in 2021. She has recently been commissioned for the Memorial to Those Enslaved and Freed at McDonogh School as well as the Lexington Market Public Artwork in Baltimore.
